The consequences reverberate within families, care teams and health plans, at great emotional and financial costs.

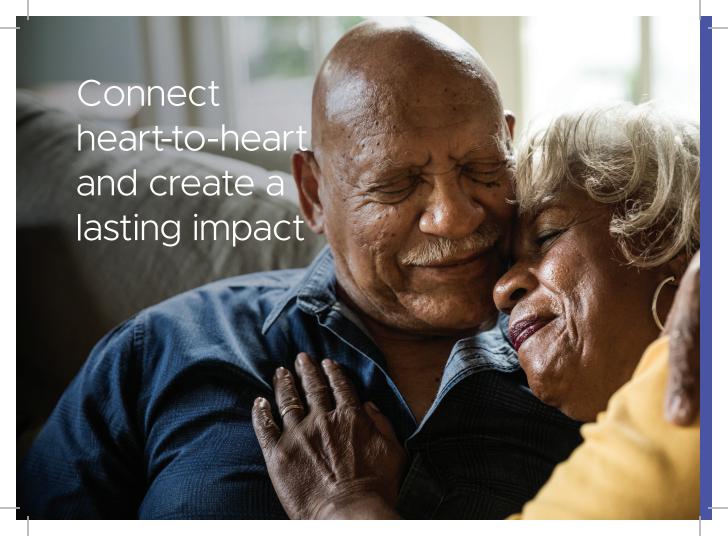
